as individual parties (the "Wrongful Death Claimants"), each of them the representative of an estate of a victim of the massive explosion in Lac-Mégantic, Quebec, from the derailment of a train operated by the Debtor,¹ and (b) wherever in the Objection "the Committee" is used as a defined term, it shall instead mean "the Wrongful Death Claimants" as defined immediately above. No other changes are made to the Objection.

The motion to which the Objection relates was originally noticed for hearing on March

12, 2014. On the record at the March 12 hearing, the Court ordered the hearing on the motion continued to 10:00 a.m. on April 8, 2014. With the 47 individual claimants now substituted for

the unofficial committee as objecting party, the Objection complies with the Court's bench ruling of March 19, 2014 concerning Rule 2019.² Accordingly, the Wrongful Death Claimants intend to be heard concerning the Objection if the Trustee proceeds on April 8, 2014, with the hearing on his motion.

Unless and until it's established otherwise, I will accept Mr. Kurr as a member of the bar of this Court and Mr. Cohn as admitted pro hac vice and well known to this Court with respect to their assertions that they represent 47 individual estates, and nothing more, not as an entity with full powers designated by lawyers, not as a committee with representative authority for the 47 or beyond the 47, but simply as lawyers representing 47 people. Which means that every pleading from now on will have to be in the names of those 47 people, every motion, every response, every plan and every disclosure statement will be in the name of those 47 individuals. And if it becomes apparent that these lawyers lack authority or have lacked authority, appropriate measures may be taken by those with standing. So ordered.
