ORDER GRANTING THIRD APPLICATION OF TRUSTEE, ROBERT J. KEACH, FOR ALLOWANCE AND PAYMENT OF COMPENSATION AND REIMBURSEMENT OF EXPENSES FOR THE PERIOD AUGUST 21, 2013 THROUGH OCTOBER 31, 2015

This matter having come before the Court on the Third Interim Application of Trustee, Robert J. Keach, for Allowance and Payment of Compensation and Reimbursement of Expenses for the Period August 21, 2013 Through October 31, 2015 (the "Fee Application"), after proper notice to all creditors and other parties-in-interest, no objections having been filed to the Fee Application, the Court having independently reviewed the Fee Application, and the Court also noting that Trustee and the United States Trustee have reached agreement with respect to an interim award with respect to the Fee Application, with all rights reserved with respect to a final fee application, it is hereby **ORDERED, ADJUDGED, and DECREED** as follows:

1. The Fee Application is granted as set forth below.
2. In relation to the Fee Application and pursuant to 11 U.S.C. §§ 326, 330 and 331, Robert J. Keach, the chapter 11 trustee (the "Trustee"), is allowed on an interim basis compensation in the aggregate amount of **\$1,560,557.84**, consisting of fees in the amount of \$1,547,104.11 and reimbursement of expenses in the amount of \$13,453.73.¹ All rights are reserved with respect to any amounts requested in the Fee Application at any final hearing

related to same, and with respect to future applications for compensation and reimbursement of expenses as may be filed by the Trustee.

3. The compensation and expenses for the Fee Application are hereby awarded on an interim basis in accordance with the applicable sections of the Bankruptcy Code, the Federal Rules of Bankruptcy Procedure, and this Court's local rules.
